J. K. Rowling was born not far from Bristol on July 15, 1965.

The Rowlings moved a few times when she was young and, for a while, lived near a forest which inspired the young Joanne to think of enchanted forests and fairy stories.

Life was not all fun and fantasy, however. When she was 15, her mother was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis. Meanwhile Joanne graduated and took several jobs, unsure of what she really wanted to do. She worked for Amnesty International but all the time she was writing, hoping to become a professional writer.

It was while she was on a train journey that the idea of Harry suddenly popped into her head – a boy who didn't know he was a wizard until he was invited to the school.

But this was a traumatic time because of the loss of her mother. So Joanne got a job as an English teacher in Portugal. Since most of her work was in the early evening, she had time during the day to write the first draft of her Harry Potter idea. While working in Oporto she married a journalism student, Jorge Arantes, but it lasted only 13 months. The marriage break-up led to the author going back to Britain with her daughter, Jessica.

She took secretarial work in Edinburgh while still writing her first Harry Potter story. For a while she thought about becoming a schoolteacher, but that was not to be.


Publisher after publisher turned down her manuscript but, in the end, Bloomsbury decided to take a risk.

J.K. Rowling has sold millions of copies of the Harry Potter stories in 62 languages. She has remarried, has a two-year-old son as well as a new baby. Joanne also finds time to devote to her special causes, single mums and people with Multiple Sclerosis.

After Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince, there will be one more book to complete the series and perhaps it will be time for something completely different.
